Register for this Year's Program.

In order to participate in Oregon Science Olympiad or an invitational, you'll need to **register a team**. While we do not have a tournament date set, our plan is for some sort of face-to-face tournament in April.

View the Draft Schedule.

We now have a [draft schedule of events](https://oregonscienceolympiad.org/schedule), also posted to our website at <https://oregonscienceolympiad.org/schedule>. Our **schedule** is based on the National Tournament schedule (in the Event Rules).

This schedule **will be updated with room numbers when a venue is decided upon**. We are still in conversation with two universities and have Seven Oak Middle School in Lebanon, OR as a backup option.

Record the State Tournament Date.

With the many schedule conflicts in April (Spring Break, Easter, other academic competitions), we have decided to host the State of Oregon Science Olympiad tournament earlier this year -- on **Saturday, March 18th, 2023**. This will also allow our winners more time to coordinate for the first in-person National Tournament in years. The National Tournament will be May 19-20 at Wichita State University.
