Be Sure to Register (& Pay) for Teams.

Each team will need to [register](#) by January 31, 2026, or earlier. After registration, please go to "[shop](#)" for the team fee payment options.

Begin Tournament Paperwork.

Although you won't know your team number until after January 31, you are welcome to begin required tournament paperwork. [this form](#) contains links to all team-level documents, as well as a place for team coaches to turn documents in when done.
